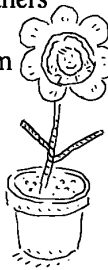
Make a
photo Flower
for someone you love

You will need:

- * colored construction paper
- * 2 green pipe cleaners
- * small flower pot
- * green florist foam (to fit in pot)
- * scissors
- * tape
- * glue
- * a photo of you!

How to make it:

- * Cut out your face from the photo. Make it a circle about 1-1/2" round.
- * Fold a piece of colored paper in half and cut out 2 flower shapes.
- * Glue your round photo in the center of one flower.
- * Make a stem by folding a pipe cleaner in half and twisting it to make it stronger.
- * Glue or tape the "stem" to the back of the flower that has your picture.
- * Glue the other flower to the back of the first one. Make sure the "stem" is in between and sticks out from the bottom.
- * Cut the other pipe cleaner in half to make leaves and then attach them to the "stem."
- * Put the green foam in the pot.
- * Plant your flower in the foam.
- * Give the flower pot to someone you love.
